Christmas Camp

Covenant Point Bible Camp

December 27 – January 1



A wonderful week to relax and spend time enjoying family, friends, winter sports, good books, and warm fireplaces while immersed in the natural beauty of Upper Michigan.

Activities include:

- Sledding and tubing
- Broomball
- Ice skating
- Cross country skiing
- Downhill skiing and snowboarding (at nearby Ski Brule)
- Sauna and polar bear dip
- Roller skating and basketball in the tabernacle
- Air hockey, ping pong, and foosball
- Games and puzzles
- Indoor swimming (\$3-6 at nearby George Young Rec. Center)
- Ice fishing (must possess valid MI fishing licence if you are above the age of 16)
- Skeet shooting

Christmas Camp begins Tuesday, December 27 at 5:00 PM and finishes up on Sunday, January 1 after brunch. The full time rate is \$265.00 for those 13 years and older, \$140.00 for those 3 – 12, and \$40.00 for children under three. (Weekly cross country ski rental or daily snowshoe rental is included.)

Our first meal together is on December 27th at 6:00pm. Plan on staying after the meal for our first meeting together.

A housing-only option is also available for the night of the 26th, at a pro-rated cost. Please indicate this on your registration form.

What to bring:

- Your own bedding, sleeping bags, pillows
- Towels, toiletries, etc.
- Warm clothing, winter coat, boots
- Slippers, books, and games for around the fireplace and in the dining hall
- Swimsuit for sauna and a “polar bear” dip

Temperatures during the day usually range from 0 to 25 degrees Fahrenheit. Camp buildings are warm, and there is wood available for the fireplaces and woodstoves. Wool sweaters, heavy jackets, and plenty of warm socks are most appropriate. Camp policy prohibits alcoholic beverages on camp grounds and smoking in camp buildings.



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Housing Options:

Maple Lodge: 8 rooms housing 3-4 people per room, three bathrooms for the lodge and a lounge area shared by all rooms.

Aspen and Birch Lodges: 2 rooms in each, housing 12 people per room, each room having a private bathroom and a small lounge shared by both rooms. (Minimum fee for one room is full-time rate for 4 adults).

Pine Lodge: 4 rooms housing 8-12 people per room, two bathrooms for the lodge and a large lounge shared by all rooms.

Cedar Lodge: 4 rooms housing 10 people per room, each room has a private bathroom and a large lounge shared by all rooms. (Minimum fee for one room is the full-time rate of 4 adults). The lounge area overlooks the indoor climbing wall which will be used by people throughout the week on a limited schedule.

Squirrel's Cage: 3 bedroom housekeeping unit; one room with two bunk beds, one room with a double bed and a bunk bed and one room with a queen size bed. (Minimum fee is the full-time rate of 5 adults).

Nature Center: 2 rooms housing 8 people per room, two bathrooms and a large lounge with a fireplace, shared by both bedrooms. (Minimum fee for one room is the full-time rate of 4 adults). NOTE: This building is in our "Back 40," so it is a farther walk to and from the Dining Hall, but our groomed cross country ski trail and a small road provide easy access (no parking is available at the Nature Center).
