At the center of our story, the place where nearly every camper, guest, and staff member gathers, is the Dining Hall. Originally built in 1935, this building has served as the hub of camp life for over 90 years. Here friendships grow, mealtime prayers are sung, and lovingly prepared meals are shared. The Dining Hall is our welcome center, dining room, meeting space, recreation area, training ground, and camp store—it truly functions as the center of camp life.

With the swift and successful completion of Phase One of our master plan – construction of the new 24-bed, ADA-accessible Hemlock Lodge, renovation of Aspen, Birch, and Pine lodges, and growth of our maintenance endowment – we now turn our attention to the Dining Hall. To prepare Covenant Point for another 100 years of ministry, the time has come to significantly renovate and expand this vital gathering place.

A Table Set for the Next Generation

Our goal is to moderately increase our dining capacity while significantly improving our camper, guest, staff, and volunteer experience. We aim to preserve and enhance what is unique about Covenant Point, guided by values of connection, sustainability, simplicity, multipurpose use, accessibility, and outdoor environments.

Project Goals and Ministry Impact

The significant renovation and expansion of Covenant Point's Dining Hall addresses critical needs to enhance ministry, expand our reach, and prepare for decades to come.

Goal	Description	Ministry Impact
Increase Dining Capacity & Comfort	Increases indoor dining capacity from 120 to approximately 200. Features sound-dampening materials, more space between tables, and improved entrance, seating and serving flows.	Removes limitations to growth, allowing program expansion and increased revenue. Improves the guest experience with new and beautified spaces for connection and reduced noise levels.
Enhance Kitchen Capacity & Efficiency	Remodels and enlarges kitchen with updated equipment. Improves cold and hot storage and serving capabilities, better supporting our trademark family-style meals.	Enables preparation of 25,000+ meals annually with increased efficiency, better catering to dietary needs, in an inviting environment. Maintains connection between guests and kitchen staff through clear sightlines.
Address Safety and Outdoor Connection	Replaces and expands aging exterior decks for safety and increased use. Maximizes windows for natural light and optimizes lakeside views.	Honors the value of experiencing God in creation. Campers and guests will have safe, beautiful outdoor spaces for rest and meeting. The building connects the indoors with the beauty of our natural environment.
Create a Clear Welcome Center & Enhance the Hub of Camp	Creates an obvious arrival point for all guests. Updates the siding and rooflines, improving the look and feel of the building.	Establishes a comfortable, attractive, multi-use, and welcoming center for guest arrivals and all of camp life.
Increase Key Functions & Meeting Space	Adds needed space: more laundry capacity and additional offices for year-round staff, and a lounge and meeting space with a large fireplace for guests.	Addresses overwhelmed facilities, improves staff efficiency and morale, and provides guests with dedicated spaces conducive to reflection, community, and play.
Improve Accessibility	Reshapes the site, introduces grade-level approaches, widens table spacing, and adds ADA-accessible bathrooms.	Extends Christlike hospitality to our campers and guests with mobility challenges by creating an environment where they can access the facility more easily.



Stewarding for the Future

The Come to the Table campaign is focused on building well, and stewarding well. The project's goal includes all aspects of site preparation, building, landscaping and ongoing maintenance.

* Assumes 4% inflation annually during the three years of fundraising, planning, and construction..

** The contribution to our maintenance endowment is critical. This fund will generate investment returns dedicated to funding the cost of depreciation of this building in perpetuity. This ensures that the next generation will inherit a well-maintained facility, upholding our commitment to stewardship and long-term mission effectiveness.

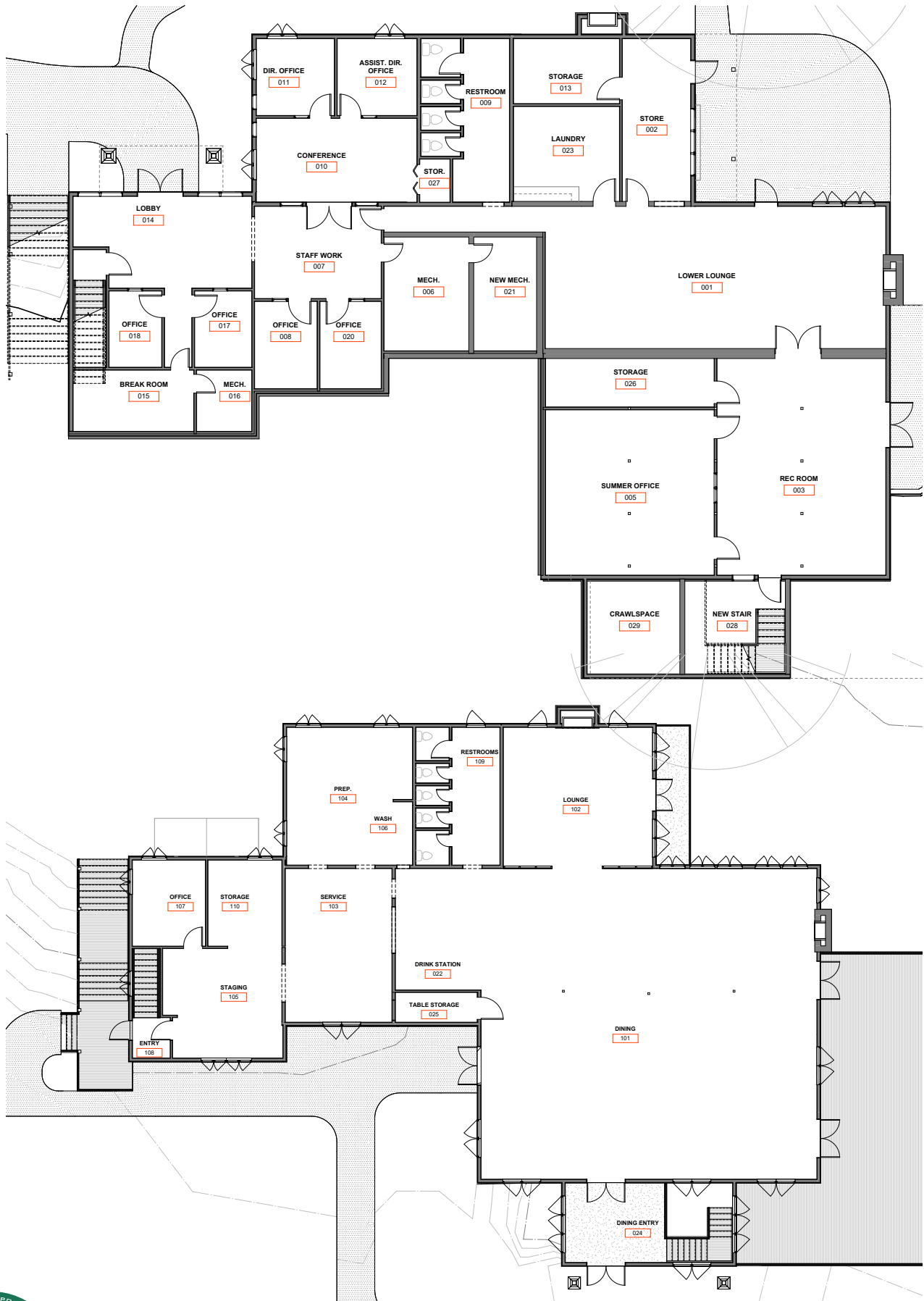


Your Invitation
